

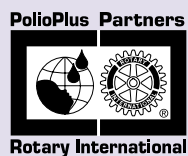

# Providing Tools for Immunization and Eradication

### What is PolioPlus Partners?

PolioPlus Partners is a Rotary Foundation program by which Rotary clubs, districts, and individual Rotarians may voluntarily assist in reaching Rotary’s goal of a polio-free world. They support the immunization activities of Rotary and its worldwide partners — World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations Children’s Fund (UNICEF), and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) — by keeping Rotarians informed of progress, promoting accurate media coverage, volunteering in National Immunization Days (NIDs), and providing needed resources in regions with, or at risk for, polio.

### Providing the Tools of Immunization and Eradication

PolioPlus Partners provides funding for tools for immunization and eradication. These tools include items that are used to attract children to the immunization site: radio and television advertisements, balloons, lollipops to reward the children, T-shirts to identify the volunteer workers, battery-operated megaphones to communicate with the villagers on immunization day, and billboards and posters to announce the time and place of the immunization. The program also supports the purchase of bicycles, boats, and four-wheel-drive vehicles for surveillance of acute flaccid paralysis and cold chain equipment like vaccine carriers and cold boxes.

### Guaranteeing Integrity

PolioPlus Partners projects are generated by either the national PolioPlus committee chair in a project country or select representatives of WHO or UNICEF. These projects are required to meet a list of eligibility criteria which were established by the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation. Once a project has met the eligibility criteria and has been approved for funding, it is added to the PolioPlus Partners Open Projects List, which is distributed to Rotarians worldwide.

### Methods of Contributing to PolioPlus Partners

Individuals, clubs, and districts can provide support to PolioPlus Partners projects through:

1. Cash contributions of any amount (eligible for Paul Harris Fellow Recognition)
2. Allocation from the District Designated Fund/*SHARE*

## The Rotary Legacy – a “plus” in PolioPlus

### Equipment

The equipment for surveillance provided by the PolioPlus Partners program will continue to be used long after polio is eradicated. It will remain as Rotary's legacy to the world and will provide support to other public health needs for years to come.



### Rallying the Community

Rotary's role as the largest source of private support for a public health initiative will provide lessons learned to future disease eradication and public health initiatives. Rotarians around the world have demonstrated that the cooperative efforts of volunteers, governments, and public health organizations can result in triumphant victories against overwhelming odds.

## PolioPlus Partners – Rotarians Thinking Globally, Acting Locally

Participation in the PolioPlus Partners program has linked clubs and districts around the world, creating partners with fellow Rotarians. Here are examples of how these districts and clubs have contributed:

- ◆ Rotarians in District 5170 (California, USA) organized a fundraising campaign called Good-bye Polio in Ghana. With the help of districts 5000, 5150, 5160, 5180, 5190, 5220, and 5230, they raised over US\$300,000 for the Ghana NID project.
- ◆ Districts 7510 (New Jersey and Pennsylvania, USA) and 5450 (northern Colorado, USA) contributed to surveillance in Nepal by supporting the purchase of vehicles, motorcycles, and bicycles.
- ◆ Swiss Rotarians carried out fundraising for Somalia and provided support for its NID and surveillance projects.
- ◆ Japanese Rotarians supported Benin, Nepal, and Bangladesh in the purchase of surveillance and social mobilization items.



## Your contribution can help achieve the goal of a polio-free world

Here is how your gift can help:

- ◆ US\$135 can provide a bicycle to distribute vaccine to villages.
- ◆ US\$200 can provide 10,000 pamphlets to inform the public about an NID.
- ◆ US\$170 can provide 10 vaccine carriers, which are used to maintain vaccine at the correct temperature.
